

# **Euro-African Dialogue Berlin Blueprint**

Education for Sustainable Development in a UNESCO  
ASPnetwork of 22 schools from Southern Africa, Poland and  
Germany,  
founded in Berlin, November 2009

Teachers from South Africa, Namibia, Zimbabwe, Lesotho, Swaziland, Poland and Germany have met in Berlin to discuss Education for Sustainable Development and how it has or has not yet been implemented in their respective countries.

All participants agree that Education for Sustainable Development is of vital importance for individuals as well as for societies. In order to provide “everybody with enough forever” ESD has to be implemented in our countries.

Bearing this in mind, the participants agreed upon concrete measures that can help to raise awareness about sustainability among the students and teachers. These are measures that can be implemented in schools and communities within 12 months.

After these 12 months the participants will meet again in Namibia to consider whether or not the first steps have been successful and whether other steps can or must be added to ensure that this process continues to move forward.
